Pauline Goss – Beyond the Basics -Watercolour Supply list

Watercolour paint: Artist grade watercolour paint tubes (Daniel Smith, Winsor Newton, Schminke, M. Graham).

For this course, you will need at least 1 yellow, 1 red and 1 blue, 1 green The following are examples of the colour pigments I like to use:

-Blue: Prussian Blue, Pthalo Blue Green Shade, Ultramarine Blue, Cobalt Blue

-Red: Quin Rose, Quin Red, Pyrrol Red, Magenta, Rose Madder

-Yellow: Hansa Yellow Light, Azo Yellow, Nickel Azo Yellow, India Yellow, Aureolin -Green: Pthalo Green(blue shade), Viridian

You don't need to buy all these colours and you can also bring your favourites.

Paper

Using the right paper is critical for good results. Good watercolour paper contains 100% cotton or rag.

Examples of 'the right paper' are full sheets or glue-bound pads of Arches, Saunders Waterford, or Baohong, 140lbs, Cold Press or Rough for textured effects.

I will mostly use quarter sheet sizes (11x15) for demos.

Brushes

Bring your favourite brushes. Suggestions are: - round brushes -square brushes -mop brush -liner -calligraphy brush.

Artist tape: Used to tape the watercolour paper sheets to the watercolour support board.
